



A Level Art (Fine Art)

<p>Assessment:</p>	<p>Year 12 – Coursework is graded linked to assessment objectives set by the exam board. Students will work towards AO's throughout the year as well as sit a 5 hour mock exam. Year 13 - All work is graded linked to the assessment objectives set by the exam board. Students will produce a design portfolio (coursework) which is worth 60% as well as a 1000 word 'related study' essay. Students will produce and plan for their externally set task set by the exam board (15 hour exam over three days) which is worth 40%.</p>
<p>Course Outline:</p>	<p>Exam Board: OCR The course at Newman Sixth will give students considerable freedom in a wide variety of media. Generally students concentrate their studies in <u>one specialist area</u>, though they may cover as wide a range of practices as their resources and expertise allows. Specialist areas that can be explored are: Painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, mixed media and installation. The course also involves study of the History of Art. Students will develop understanding of the methods artists have used and develop empathy for selected work. Students will have the opportunity to explore and experiment a range of media's to develop their practice in our well - resourced and fully staffed art classroom. Students will also have access to digital media and a print press to aid their work. This will lead to student's chosen area of personal study for the second year of the course and final assessment. Students will also be supported by visits to galleries and other relevant locations to broaden their primary research.</p>
<p>Progression routes:</p>	<p>This course will support students moving onto higher education courses offered by universities in a variety of creative fields, including graphic design, 3D Design, architecture, animation and print making which could lead into careers in the creative industries.</p>
<p>Course requirements:</p>	<p>Grade 4 or above. Portfolio of work to show skills, knowledge and techniques.</p>
